

Fellowship Lunch for April was this past Sunday. Before Sunday School began, I took my dish of Orange Fluff to the kitchen. Hope Oakes, Susan Smith, and Jenn Mearkle were already there putting out placemats and salt and pepper shakers. Susan saw my hesitation in finding a place for my dish in the refrigerator and suggested it would fit in one of the drawers.

When the worship service was over, we gathered in the Fellowship Hall. The tables were laden with more food than would be eaten. If you were there, you remember that Tom Hatcher had to call us to attention for "Happy Birthday" and the blessing because the real purpose of the Fellowship Lunch had already gotten started.

The real purpose of Fellowship Lunch is the noise of the conversations in the serving lines, at the tables of seven or eight who balance eating and discussion for the quickest hour of the week, the talking among the members of the shepherding group who gather the trash, run the dishwasher, and divvy up leftover fried chicken.

When I joined First Presbyterian in January of 2018, I soon experienced my first Fellowship Lunch. My first thought about the lunch was this: Isn't once a month a little too often to put on a lunch? (Cooking is a challenge for me.)

After seven years of Fellowship Lunches, I get it. All the time I have spent washing dishes, drying utensils, sweeping the floor, and wiping tables has been what has made me know that this church is where I belong. There are few things more important to me than serving the Father with a group of loving believers. This I am blessed to do at First Presbyterian Church.

The Fellowship Lunch for this month is Sunday, May 18. I'll see you there.




The Agape Sunday School class, taught by Tom Richardson, has begun a study of the weekly lectionary readings. The Revised Common Lectionary is a set of scripture readings designed to guide worship and study throughout the church year, beginning with Advent. The lectionary is organized on a three-year cycle, with each year focused on one of the Synoptic Gospels: Year A is Matthew, Year B is Mark, and Year C--our current year--is Luke. In addition to the Gospel, each lectionary lesson typically includes an Old Testament lesson, a Psalm, and an Epistle lesson. Many Christian denominations around the world use the lectionary as a thematic focus for worship; this common worship supports a spirit of unity for Christian education and Christian life. Tracie includes the monthly readings in First Word each month. The readings and resources for study can be found at pcusa.org and workingpreacher.org. All are welcome in Sunday School!
