

#### Pentecost

Pentecost is Sunday, June 8. Pentecost is the coming of the Holy Spirit to believers after the Ascension of Jesus. We celebrate Pentecost at church on that Sunday. We often wear red to symbolize the "tongues of fire" that rested on the heads of the apostles.

#### \*\*\*\*\*\*

Does the Holy Spirit speak to *me*? How do I know if the Holy Spirit *is* speaking to me? No tongues of fire above me. No angel appearing before me. No audible voice from heaven. Not even a tap on the shoulder.

But there *is* a Scripture from the Word specifically directing me. There is the strong voice in my heart leading me. There is counseling from a trusted friend in Christ instructing me. There are assurances from a sermon that show me the way.

How do I respond when the Holy Spirit *is* speaking to me? The response to the Holy Spirit should always be obedience. Peace is the gift the Holy Spirit gives me when I follow Him. The Holy Spirit may lead me out of my comfort zone, but He will not lead me into a situation or action that is wrong or hurtful to myself or others.

My prayer for this Pentecost is that I will be ever more sensitive to the "still, small voice" of the Holy Spirit.

The Agape Sunday School class, taught by Tom Richardson, has begun a study of the weekly lectionary readings. The Revised Common Lectionary is a set of scripture readings designed to guide worship and study throughout the church year, beginning with Advent. The lectionary is organized on a three-year cycle, with each year focused on one of the Synoptic Gospels: Year A is Matthew, Year B is Mark, and Year C--our current year--is Luke. In addition to the Gospel, each lectionary lesson typically includes an Old Testament lesson, a Psalm, and an Epistle lesson. Many Christian denominations around the world use the lectionary as a thematic focus for worship; this common worship supports a spirit of unity for Christian education and Christian life. Tracie includes the monthly readings in First Word each month. The readings and resources for study can be found at <u>pcusa.org</u> and <u>workingpreacher.org</u>. All are welcome in Sunday School!










FPC would like to provide bottled water when we serve at Loaves and Fishes.
